

The Declaration of Oviedo:

Ten proposals for incorporating Prevention in drug policies







Call for countries to dedicate at least 25% of their drug demand reduction strategy and policy budget on prevention by 2030

Promote an approach to prevention targeting all ages of development and favoring earlier prevention

Foster research and evaluation to avoid ineffective or counterproductive prevention strategies

Broaden the vision of prevention responses to shift the focus from drugs to the individual and the community

Mainstream intersectional approaches in prevention for all populations at risk

Boost multi-stakeholder prevention systems and documenting effectiveness and cost-effectiveness when implemented globally

Provide universal coverage in a continuum of care

Prioritize action in low- and middle-income countries

Empower current and future generations of prevention professionals

Monitor the status of prevention policies through accountable surveillance
